

1. Install the fonts in the fonts directory to your machine. They're free as in beer, and Inconsolata is free as in speech. Some examples may not work without these fonts.
2. Install your choice of vector editing software. One good choice is Inkscape, free for download at <http://inkscape.org/> -- which has tutorials and other documentation at <http://wiki.inkscape.org>
3. Determine the size of your signs. The Base_Templates directory has a selection of common sizes to start with, or set the document size as needed and add the plain_logo image.
4. With the base template open or created, create your organizational template. Include a web site or toll free number and the required statutory notices. Prepositioning the words 'Libertarian' and 'for' can speed up design of signs for candidates.
5. Open your saved organizational template and add the candidate and needed office.
6. For professionally printed signs, send your SVG or other vector format image to your sign printer.
7. For volunteer labor screen printed signs, set the color of all non-white elements to black and separate into separate images for different colors as well as separating out the Liberty L Logo to a separate file. Print to transparencies or have a copy center somewhere do it for you. You can then follow the directions in the Screen Printing tutorial directory.

Includes a tutorial to create a simple example with a matching template that will meet the needs of most.



..But with experience, you can do more complex solutions.



Have your signs done professionally, or use art grade screen printing supplies and volunteer labor.



...Or use a stock example to help your sign company do it for you. Be sure to send them the fonts and Liberty L logo as well.
